



STEVE KLEI - Head Coach

Steve Klei enters his second season with the College Park Skyhawks after being named the fourth head coach in Skyhawks franchise history on September 17, 2024. In addition to manning the helm as College Park's head coach, Klei will also serve as an assistant coach for the Atlanta Hawks under Head Coach Quin Snyder. Klei finished his first season with a 26-24 record, including a 9-7 Showcase Cup record and 17-17 regular season record. Under Klei's lead, the Skyhawks continued to dominate on the defensive side of the ball, finishing in the top-10 in multiple defensive categories for both seasons combined, while also breaking single season franchise records for most three pointers (668), most assists (1211), and most rebounds (2337).

Klei was instrumental in developing players such as Atlanta Hawks forward Mouhamed Gueye, who spent 24 games with the Skyhawks on assignment before ending the year as a consistent starter for the Atlanta Hawks, where he appeared in 33 games (28 starts). Klei also saw four players receive their NBA callups in Kevon Harris, Tony Bradley, Daeqwon Plowden and Dominick Barlow.

Prior to taking over the helm of the Skyhawks, Klei spent the latter half of the 2022-23 and 2023-24 seasons with the Hawks as an assistant coach. During the first part of the 2022-23 season, Klei was director of player development with Italian professional team Olimpia Milano, competing in the EuroLeague during his tenure in Milan.

Klei worked alongside Snyder with the Utah Jazz from 2016-22, spending time in the DAV program including as head video coordinator prior to becoming a coaching associate. Klei's time in Utah saw playoff appearances in all six seasons,



including three trips to the Western Conference Semifinals and three division championships, going back-to-back in the 2020-21 and 2021-22 seasons.

Prior to his time in Utah, Klei spent the 2015-16 season with the Canton Charge (now Cleveland Charge), the NBA G League affiliate of the Cleveland Cavaliers, as a basketball operations assistant under current Brooklyn Nets head coach Jordi Fernandez, and current Cleveland Cavaliers General Manager, Mike Gansy. As part of Fernandez's staff, Klei helped guide the Charge to a 31-19 regular season record, advancing to the second round of the NBA G League playoffs.

A native of Northport, New York, Klei attended Indiana University where he was a manager on the men's basketball team under Tom Crean from 2011-15 and graduated with a degree in Kinesiology, Sports Marketing and Management.



KARI KORVER - Assistant Coach

Kari Korver, a native of Paramount, California, begins her second season with the Skyhawks after most recently serving as Director of Basketball Operations with the LA Sparks of the WNBA from 2020-22. Prior to her time with the Sparks, Korver spent two years at Northern Colorado as an assistant coach, helping guide the women's basketball team to a WNIT appearance during her first season.

A five-year player at UCLA from 2012-17 (sat out 2013-14 due to an ACL injury), she was voted team captain for four straight seasons and finished tied for the most three-pointers made in Bruins history (256).



O'NEIL HOLDER - Assistant Coach

Holder enters his fifth season within the Atlanta Hawks organization, and second with the College Park Skyhawks. He started with the Hawks during the 2021-22 season as a video assistant, before transitioning to DAV under Snyder for the 2023-24 season. Prior to Atlanta, Holder was an assistant coach at Montclair State University from 2019-21.

A native of East Stroudsburg, Pennsylvania, Holder was a standout forward at Moravian University from 2015-19, finishing First-Team All-Conference two of his four years, and earned the Landmark Conference Rookie of the Year his freshman season.



SETH JACKSON - Assistant Coach

Jackson enters his second season in College Park after serving as an assistant coach with the Oklahoma City Blue from 2022-24, most recently part of the squad that defeated the Maine Celtics 2-1 in the 2024 NBA G League Finals. Jackson helped guide the Blue to a 21-13 regular season record and earn the top rebounding team in the G League, plus top three finishes in points per game and assists per game.

Prior to serving as a video coordinator with the Thunder during the 2021-22 season, Jackson held roles as the director of scouting & analytics at George Washington University (2020-21), assistant coach at McKendree University (2018-2020) and as a video coordinator and operations intern at the Grand Rapids Drive.

The Richmond, Virginia, native played professionally overseas with BC Balkan in



Bulgaria (2015-16) and with Vllaznia Shkodra in Albania (2016-17) after a four-year collegiate career at Truman State University. Jackson was a four-time All-Conference honoree, was named the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) Freshman of the Year in 2011-12 and capped his career ranked third on the Bulldogs' all-time scoring list with 1,655 points.



ENZO LI - Assistant Coach

Li enters his second year in College Park after most recently serving as an assistant coach with the Beijing Ducks of the Chinese Basketball Association from 2022-24. Prior to serving as an assistant, Li was the head coach of the Ducks' Chinese Basketball Development League's team, the CBA's equivalent of the G League. Li has served as an International Guest Coach on the Atlanta Hawks NBA 2K24 and 2K25 Summer League teams, where he facilitated team practices, individual workouts, and scouting.

A graduate with a bachelor's in mathematics from Tsinghua University in Beijing, Li was a five-year walk-on player from 2009-14 on the varsity basketball team which made two National Final Fours. Li also earned his masters of sports management from Columbia University in 2017.
